**1. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL:**

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson, Charles Ridley, at 5:30 p.m.

**A. “Thou Shall Not Kill” Summer Program**

She spoke to business owners who agreed to contribute their time for different types of clinics for the youth to participate in during the summer. Some business owners offered nail clinics and photography clinics. Others offered to make monetary donations. Ms. Annechild also spoke about an academic program available at Carver Elementary. The cost for the academic program is \$25.00 per week for each child. She then discussed possible sites to host the summer program activities.

Mr. Ridley stated that the members of the “Thou Shall Not Kill” initiative would like to meet with Mr. Herrera regarding the Olympics, as well as, Mr. Shelly Weil regarding the Boy Scouts.

Mr. Sam Ballen and Ms. Kathie DeGroot spoke about how enthusiastic they are about offering their services assisting with the summer program.

**6. NEW BUSINESS:**

**A. Getting Information To The Police Department**

Chief Schroeder stated that another form of getting information to the Police Department other than the TIPS line anonymously is the use of Hotspot Cards. He explained that Hotspot Cards are given out at Homeowners Association meetings.

Mr. Ferrer suggested advertising the TIPS Line in the News for Neighborhood or in the water bills.

Chief Schroeder stated that new student members will be appointed at the City Commission meeting on July 10, 2007.
