CITY OF DELRAY BEACH LAUNCHES FREE SHUTTLE BUS SERVICE

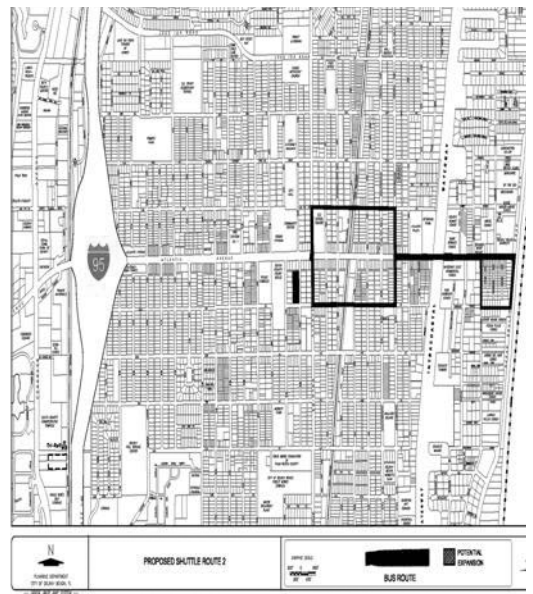
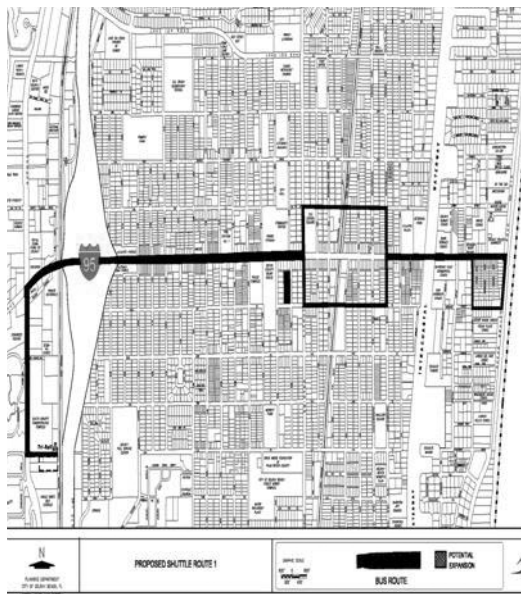


The City of Delray Beach and the Community Redevelopment Agency will launch a free shuttle bus service to begin in November, 2006. Two routes are planned to provide public transportation through downtown Delray. One route will shuttle passengers from the Tri-Rail Station on North Congress Avenue, through the downtown area, to the Municipal Beach and back. The other route will run from Swinton Avenue to the Municipal Beach and back.

The shuttle buses running from the Tri-Rail Station on North Congress, (Route 1), will travel down West Atlantic Avenue to Swinton and then run parallel to Atlantic Avenue traveling on SE 1st Street through the downtown area and back to Atlantic on 6th (Federal Highway), continuing East, across the bridge and to the beach at A1A. Going back, the route will take the

busses up Atlantic Avenue to 5th (Federal Highway), and then move to NE 1st Street to travel west through the downtown to Swinton Avenue and move onto West Atlantic for the trip back to Tri-Rail.

The Downtown Roundabout bus, (Route 2), will follow the same routes confined to the downtown area from Swinton Avenue to the Municipal Beach. This will be a seven day a week service with busses scheduled to run from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM Monday through Friday, 10:00 AM to 8:00 PM Saturday and Noon to 8:00 PM on Sunday, with each trip taking approximately 20 minutes to 30 minutes for Route 2 and 1 Hour for Route 1, the Tri-Rail loop, depending on local traffic. 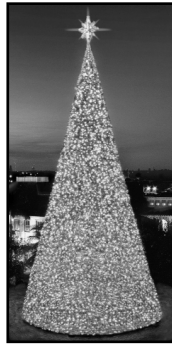

DELRAY BEACH GOES WI-FI

In the Spring of 2007, Delray Beach residents and visitors will be able to access the Internet with their wireless enabled lap-top computers in the City. The City Commission has accepted a proposal made by Team ATCI to develop and install a wi-fi system (wireless Internet access) for Delray Beach operating from I-95 to A1A and several blocks north and south of Atlantic Avenue. The plan is to connect the entire City in the next year. This wireless service will be a free service for users outside in open spaces with optional rate structures for increased speeds. Residential and commercial connections will be available upon installation at rate structures based on multiple tiers of speeds. The projected subscription

rates are substantially lower than those currently offered by other Internet connection systems. Special consideration will be given to eligible applicants establishing a minimum rate, not to exceed \$10.00 per month. Team ATCI is also offering up to 100 PCs (Personal Computers) for qualified low-income units in their contribution to reduce the unconnected units within the City and increasing the numbers of our residents with Internet access. Rates, timetables and contractual agreements will be announced shortly.
