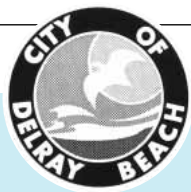

OFFICER JOHNNY PUN REMEMBERED

Officer "Johnny" Jean-Albert Pun, born November 22, 1967, died September 10, 2005. Johnny, just 37 years old when he died in a tragic accident on Okeechobee Boulevard in West Palm Beach, is survived by his wife, Love, and three children; Sahphere, Maya, and Jacq. Funeral services were held on Friday, September 16, 2005 at the St. Thomas More Catholic Church in Boynton Beach with over 1,300 attending and giving testimony to an extraordinary young man who gave of himself to others every day of his life.

As a member of the Delray Beach Police Department, Johnny became known throughout the community as an accomplished officer and a very special human being. In 1998, he and his department colleague, Fred Glass, had an idea to help youngsters, on the edge of lost hope and crime, regain their self-esteem through tutoring, training and replacing a fear of life with a love of life. In 2002, their dream became a reality. For over the past 3 years, The Youth Vocational Charter School has taken dozens of at-risk-youth off the streets and into an educational environment, a caring environment enabling them to become productive citizens as opposed to predictable felons. In order to continue Johnny Pun's legacy at the Youth Vocational Charter School and in support of his young family, The Delray Citizens for Delray Police has established The Johnny Pun Memorial. CITY OF DELRAY BEACH POLICE ADVISORY BOARD APPLICATIONS DUE BY OCTOBER 14, 2005

The City Commission of Delray Beach approved a recommendation by the Mayor's Committee on Race Relations to form a Police Advisory Board made up of Delray Beach resident-citizens. The City is now seeking applicants to fill the 13 seats on that advisory board. The deadline for applications is Friday, October 14, 2005.

As is the process for all City advisory boards, those who wish to participate on the Police Advisory Board may apply at the City Clerk's offices in City Hall or go on-line to the City's website (mydelraybeach.com), going to City Departments and scroll to the City Clerk heading and click on Advisory Boards for the on-line application.

All applications received will be reviewed by the Mayor's Committee on Race Relations at a regular meeting with the date to be announced. They will review all applications received and make their recommendations to the City Commission for final selections. THE 7TH ANNUAL GARLIC FESTIVAL BRINGS A SPECIAL FRAGRANCE TO DELRAY BEACH

Friday, November 11th, Saturday, November 12th and Sunday, November 13th are this year's dates for the 7th Annual Garlic Festival on the grounds of Old School Square in Delray Beach. This aromatic affair attracts tens of thousands of garlic lovers every year to enjoy nationally known entertainers, fine foods, arts, crafts and family fun. Garlic aficionados have the opportunity to watch gourmet chefs cook up unique dishes and take away great garlic recipes. The entertainment on the Pavilion Stage includes Little Feat, The Gin Blossoms and Dickey Betts & Great Southern.

The Delray Beach Garlic Festival concept includes a fund raising aspect for non-profit organizations that volunteer to help operate the event. 16 non-profits and 450 volunteers for the past six years have made it possible for the Garlic Festival to contribute over \$90,000 back to the community. This year, \$1.00 from every admission ticket will be donated to Project Thanksgiving.

The Garlic Festival hours are: Friday, November 11th, 5:00 pm to 10:00 pm, Saturday, November 12th, 11:00 am to 10:00 pm and Sunday, November 13th, 11:00 am to 7:00 pm. Admission is \$8.00 and children under 10 years of age are free. Parking will be available at the City Hall parking lots (free) and the South County Courthouse Garage for \$5.00.
